1. MALAYSIA'S DEFINITION

Aging Society (Senior

Citizens)

Retirement Age

Comprises of 8% of total population

Aged 60



2. CHALLENGES

Physical

- Health Problems
- Disabled (Mobility Restrictions)

Economics

- Low Income
- No Income

Social

- Lack of Housing
- Lack of Activities



3. STEPS TAKEN BY THE GOVERNMENT TO OVERCOME CHALLENGES

Financial Assistance

- Discounts Senior citizens pay cheaper rate for public transport, health services
- Monthly allowance Senior citizens with low income is eligible for hardship allowance
- Public Housing Resposibilities born by federal government, KLCH and private sector.



3. STEPS TAKEN BY THE GOVERNMENT TO OVERCOME CHALLENGES

Facilities

- Public Housing Resposibilities born by federal government, KLCH and private sector.
 - Cost of housing units must not be more than RM42,000 (USD 12,000)
- Senior Citizens Activity Center
 - These centers are created to cater for social activities e.g: meeting point, social gatherings, sports and health equipment



4. KLCH PUBLIC HOUSING

KL Senior Citizens Population 8.5% or 147,000

Size: min 650 sq ft and max 800 sq ft

Total Units: 74, 704 units

Out of a total of 74,704 units, 4.35% (3,250 units) is at present occupied by Senior Citizens







5. ROLE OF KLCH IN PUBLIC HOUSING

- KLCH is responsible for all maintenance, cleanliness and security for all public housing under KLCH
- Senior Citizens are given privileges such as:

Financial Assistance

- In certain cases senior citizens with low income are given free rental
- Allowing the senior citizens to operate small business activities within the public housing area to supplement income



5. ROLE OF KLCH IN PUBLIC HOUSING

Infrastructure

Priority given to occupy units from ground level to level 5

For easier mobility all public housing units are equipped with handicapped friendly facilities

Social

- Creation of Senior Citizens Club
- 1 Malaysia Clinic
