SYMBOL MARK OF THE ASIAN-PACIFIC CITY SUMMIT

"A" which has the meaning "Answer" or "First Class" taken from the initial letter of "Asian-Pacific City Summit" is used to form the shape of the symbol mark.

Each vertex of the triangle has a meaning "Exchange," "Understanding" and "Cooperation." The triangle which is formed by tying the three vertex together indicates the state of various countries in the Asian-Pacific region gathering for the Summit.

Since ancient times, the triangle has been a symbol of unity for all things under the sun. It is to embody the image of the direction which this summit heads for.

The shape of the wave in the center symbolizes the swell of actions to be created by the participating countries in the Asian-Pacific City Summit and the Summit itself.

The symbol color Marine Blue is the sea including the Pacific Ocean and it symbolizes "Hope," "Truth" and "Trust."

PREFACE



Fukuoka City held the "Asian-Pacific City Summit" in September 1994 with the participation of 21 cities from 11 countries and regions in the Asian-Pacific area.

It was the first time for the heads of cities in the Asian-Pacific region to get together and exchange ideas to solve urban problems.

Since the Asian-Pacific region has become the center of public attention, it was indeed a very significant program held at an appropriate time with many fruitful results.

While economic development is progressing in the Asian-Pacific region, we are facing a serious urban problem, due to the concentration of population in the cities.

In the sessions, active discussions took place under a theme "Harmony between Urban Development and Human Living Environment in the Asian-Pacific Era." Through these discussions we were able to mutually deepen understandings regarding the present situation and policies of each city and were able to recognize the importance of mutual cooperation.

In order to form an "Asian-Pacific Urban Network" to solve urban problems, it is advocated in the Fukuoka Declaration, that this Summit be continued. Therefore, it was determined that the 2nd Summit will be held in Guangzhou, China in 1996. It truly can be said, that the peace and stability of the world is due to exchange, between city to city, regions to regions, thus overcoming differences in politics, economics, language and culture. For the Asian-Pacific region which possesses climatic differences and is abundant in nature, it is essential that it promote improvement of its cities in harmony with its economic growth in order to make a sustainable development in the future. I sincerely hope that this report be widely used to solve the problems in urban development in the Asian-Pacific region.

In closing, I would like to once again thank all people concerned for the great efforts they have rendered for the success of this Summit.
