PREFACE



The Asian-Pacific City Summit has been held every other year since 1994, gathering the leaders of Asian-Pacific cities for the purpose of building a collaborative network within the region for solving various urban problems.

As a way to complement the city leaders' summit meetings, the Working Level Conference has been held in the alternate years following the Summit, providing the officials who are directly involved in administrative work with opportunities to share their knowledge and expertise, as well as to learn from each other through fieldwork. "Traffic

Issues" and "Waste Treatment and Disposal" have been selected as the main themes for the previous Working Level Conferences. The 2nd Working Level Conference held in 1997 in Fukuoka City, in particular, has produced further fruitful results. Through the cooperation rendered by the UN Centre for Human Settlements (Habitat), technical transfer of the "Fukuoka Method", the landfill method of waste disposal introduced at the 2nd Working Level Conference, has been realized in other cities, including those participating in the Summit.

With "the Supply of Safe, Clean Water to the City" as the main objective, this year's Working Level Conference enabled us to actively exchange views and expertise in order to secure a reliable supply of safe and quality drinking water in ever-developing urban cities. Activities have been carried out through various programs including presentations, fieldwork at the Water Quality Control Laboratory, and inspection of the Water Distribution Control Center.

These meaningful results brought home to us the realization that although the systems and problems surrounding each participating city may vary, we share numbers of common solutions to these problems. In this sense, it was truly beneficial to be able to make a step forward in building a waterworks network among participating cities. It is my sincere hope that through these experiences, we will be able to join our forces together with other participating cities in contributing to the sustainable development of the Asian Pacific region.

Last but not least, I wish to take this opportunity to express my deep appreciation to Dr. Hideo Utsumi, Professor of Kyushu University Graduate School, and to Ms. Keiko Yamamoto, Development Specialist of the Japan International Cooperation Agency for their considerable contribution in hosting the Conference. 
