### **5. Theme**

#### **Theme: Sustainable City Redevelopment: The New Approaches**

Cities create not only great opportunities for human development, but also serious social problems. Throughout recorded history, people have been drawn to cities to find work, pursue careers and find excitement. However, this influx also creates great urban problems. It is anticipated that in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, large urban cities will not be able to provide adequate services for their residents resulting unmanageable urban problems.

The urban problems currently do not exist idly but rapidly develop from time to time. The conference aims to indicate the new approaches for city to redevelop which must be clear, practical and effective for the progressive problems.

#### **Sub Session 1: New Urbanism: Values, City Governance and People Participation**

##### **Discussion Issue: Quality of Life**

Quality of life involves with what people feel, see, hear, smell, and taste. People should have opportunity to consume such things qualitatively. Social welfare, sports, health care, education, information, culture, entertainment etc are included. The quality of those things must be developed, however, it will be difficult if they are provided by only the local government's budget. Many cities are successful in quality of life development through new methods such as privatization, market oriented procedure and people participation in policy making.

##### **Discussion Issue: Cultural and Tradition Rehabilitation.**

Conventional cultural and tradition maintains the cities in order. It appears that culture and tradition are gradually vanished and replaced by new form of ways of life and believes. People have the tendency to ignore the beauty of old culture and tradition. The rehabilitation should be taken into consideration.

#### **Sub Session 2: New Public Management: Public Private Partnerships and Creating Opportunities for All**

##### **Discussion Issue: City Economic Development: Opportunity for all**

Communities are considered as a grass root and a large part of urban residents. Cities must ensure that professions opportunities must be provided through training, investment provision, investment advise and employment.

Hence, cities should provide ecological and sustainable professional opportunity. The conference may not only focus on the convention vocational training, but also the source of fund for investment,

payback procedure, advice and quality control to ensure the effective use of fund and sustainable project.

**Discussion Issue: Education Development.**

Although the primary, secondary, and junior high school are compulsory, the quality of instructors, equipment and teaching technology are considered not equal. The cities should equalize the quality of education by new methods. Marketing mechanism and competition, for instance, may be applied to raise the quality of education provision. Further, the community pre-school child care center should be provided adequately. This equalize the opportunity for children in childhood development.

**Discussion Issue: Tourism Development**

Tourism involves with object heritage, human resources, monetary process, quality of goods and services, variety of choices, reliability, standard, security etc. Once the cities perceives that tourism industry can be a main channel that brings about revenue, the standards for all items involved in tourism industry should be set. This is to mobilize higher income and also keep it sustainable.
