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# Jakarta in Numbers

Population: 11.063.324 (2019)

Area: 662,33 km<sup>2</sup>

Population density 16.704 persons/km<sup>2</sup>, well above the Indonesian national Population Density of 141 persons/km<sup>2</sup>

2020 data shows that the densest Subdistrict in Jakarta is **Kali Anyar Subdistrict in West Jakarta Administrative City**.


- Population density: 95.191 persons/km<sup>2</sup>
- 5,7 times more than the average density for Jakarta
- 679 times denser than the Indonesian national average

## Case Study: Distribution of Education Levels in Jakarta Based on Location and Gender

### Overview

Citizens age 10 + who has never attended school: 1,14%

Citizens currently attending school: 17,34%

Citizens no longer in school: 81,52%

### Location Matters

Highest number of citizens not attending school is in Kepulauan Seribu Regency (2,26%). This is considerably higher compared to the overall number for Jakarta (1,14%), and to the administrative area with the lowest recorded number, which is South Jakarta Administrative City (0,74%).

Kepulauan Seribu is a remote area, causing difficulties in constructing and providing complete educational facilities and services.

### Gender as a Factor


Citizens age 10 or above who has never attended school:

Male : 0,81%



An online platform for potential collaborators to participate the **Large-scale Social Collaboration (Kolaborasi Sosial Skala Besar – KSBB)** program in Jakarta. The platform provides overview on the programs, map of locations/areas in need and detailed data on their specific needs, assistance for collaborators if they wish to donate to certain locations in any form, and complete information about ongoing collaboration programs.



Tabs to view other KSBB Programs





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Unemployment rate went down, from 10,95% in August 2020 to 8.51% in February 2021.
