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Jakarta in Numbers

Population: 11.063.324 (2019)

Area: **662,33 km²**


Population density 16.704 persons/km², well above the Indonesian national Population Density of 141 persons/km²

2020 data shows that the densest Subdstrict in Jakarta is Kali Anyar Subdistrict in West Jakarta Administrative City.

- Population density: 95.191 persons/km²
- 5,7 times more than the average density for Jakarta
- 679 times denser than the Indonesian national average

Case Study: Distribution of Education Levels in Jakarta Based on Location and Gender

Overview

Citzens age 10 + who has never attended school: 1,14%

Citizens currently attending school: 17,34%

Citizens no longer in school: 81,52%

Location Matters

Highest number of citizens not attending school is in Kepulauan Seribu Regency (2,26%). This is considerably higher compared to the overall number for Jakarta (1,14%), and to the administrative area with the lowest recorded number, which is South Jakarta Administrative City (0,74%).

Kepulauan Seribu is a remote area, causing difficulties in constructing and providing complete educational facilities and services.

Gender as a Factor


Citizens age 10 or above who has never attended school:












KSBB Collaborators
